Recreating 'Pride and Prejudice' on stage

The teacher trainees of Nirmala Institute of Education will be presenting a semi-musical rendition of Jane Austen's 'Pride and Prejudice' on stage, at Ravindra Bhavan Margao

As you walk through the corridors of Nirmala Institute of Education, Altinho-Panjim, among the sea of green clad teacher trainees you will notice a few individuals in 19th century English attire. As one follows their trail, one is led to a place that echoes of music and the atmosphere tells a tale of many hearts. Here is where the rehearsals for the upcoming production of the educational institute are being held, a semi-musical play 'Pride and Prejudice' – an adaptation based on the classic 19th century novel by Jane Austen.

Cancer Awareness Run on World Cancer Day

'I Am and I Will' is the ongoing World Cancer Day theme for 04 February 2020. Celebrating World Cancer Day, The King's School will host a 10 km Cancer Awareness Run led by well known long distance runner and Athletics Coach at the school, Bhupendra Kshatri.

The run is from the King's School located at Sao Jose de Areal to Bolshe Circle, Gogol and back. The 'I Will Run for Cancer' will flag-off at 8am from the school premises, while reporting for the same will commence from 7:30am. The run is open to the general public who will join school parents, staff, students and school alumni.

The King's School, January 5, 2020, hosted its annual 4th edition of the Ride to Conquer Cancer and raised Rs 2,07,000, which was disbursed to patients suffering from cancer. Since 2012 till date, The King's School and Childcare School, along with its parents, staff, students and well wishers under the aegis of its Chairman Melvin Pereira and Director Ligia Pereira, over the last eight years have raised Rs 1.75 crores and financially reached out to about 320 cancer patients besides maintaining the Paediatric Chemotherapy Ward at Goa Medical College, Bambolim. The school for the last eight years organises four flagship events i.e. an annual Dine & Dance, Ride to Conquer Cancer, the King's Football League and the King's Premier League (cricket) to raise funds, create awareness and reach out to cancer patients.

The run for cancer initiative is the first of its kind that we're doing, not to raise funds for cancer patients but to create an awareness for a healthy lifestyle to avoid diseases like cancer

while we want to spread a message of hope among cancer patients that we stand by them always," asserted Melvin Pereira, Chairman of the King's School. The school director, Ligia Pereira, reiterated the need to stand with cancer patients and to sensitise the entire school students, staff and parents with a value that will last a lifetime to share and care. As part of fitness, the run will also include enthusiastic cyclists who can sign in for the 5 kms, 7 kms and 10 kms run. There will also be a 2 kms run for those below the age of 12 years who would also like to lend their energy and enthusiasm towards the Cancer Awareness Run.

TALK ON SCHOLARLY COMMUNICATION

Nowadays, getting published in Scopus / Web of Science indexed journals adds status to a researcher, however getting published in these journals can be a researcher's nightmare. Scholarly communication is the process of academicians, scholars and researchers sharing and publishing their research findings so that they are available to the wider academic community and beyond. Traditionally, scholarly communication is found in the formal literature – in journal articles, conference proceedings, book chapters and books. Today, the landscape is changing dramatically with the introduction of Internet.

Keeping this in mind, the Library and Information Centre in association with Research, Development and Innovation Cell of Dnyanprassarak Mandal recently organised a talk on the topic of Scholarly Communication. The resource person was Dr Murari P Tapaswi, former Librarian of NIO and Officer on Special Duty (OSD) of Goa University. In all, 70 faculty members participated in this talk.

A publication in the prestigious / reputed journals is important for the academicians, working in the colleges and universities. But due to predatory print and open access journals, finding the suitable journal for the publication of the article is somewhat tricky, it needs lot of information and searching skills, such as whether the particular journal is published by fly by night publisher, is it recognised by the UGC, is it indexed in the Web of Science or Scopus database or not? Writing is easy, but publishing in a good academic journal is the problem as it invites identifying which journal is good or bad for publishing the articles.



He demonstrated how to identify the impact factor of the journals available in different databases, what are the quality criteria? How to match your manuscript and other important aspects were revealed in this session. Further, the resource person emphasised about the how predatory journals are acting without having proper mechanism of Impact factor, he also cautioned the participants about publishing in such journals as it will not fetch any API score for the promotion of the teachers.
